Knowledge: Knowing applicable laws, rules & policies as well as the principles of family-centered practice

Understanding: Comprehending the reasons for the laws, rules, policies, & best practices of an ethical, family-centered approach.

Application: Applying knowledge & understanding to interactions with families in an ethical, family-centered way.

Analysis: Analyzing facts, policies, & ethical considerations to determine responses.

Synthesis: Creating new responses to unfamiliar situations within an ethical framework

Evaluation: Assessing the effectiveness of responses & planning for future improvements
